## How did Fingal Head Coastcare (FHC) get rid of the Bitou Bush?

Example Forest Walk.

The South African Bitou Bush planted by the sand mining company became a problem and a monoculture which overtook other species.

FHC trialled many methods to control the Bitou Bush.

The final method was to weed around the trees which were to be retained; slash the standing Bitou Bush and leave it on the ground; spray any new regrowth.



Rainforest species propagated by FHC were planted in the cleared areas.

This work has helped to regenerate Littoral Rainforest, a nationally critically endangered ecological community - there are only 1,624 hectares left in NSW. We now have 18 hectares of Littoral Rainforest on the Fingal Peninsula, 16 hectares of which have been planted by FHC.
